What is a Welcome Conversation?

Welcome Conversations provide a warm, supportive introduction for volunteers in a new role, ensuring they feel valued and prepared from the start. During the conversation, an independent, accredited volunteer in a similar role meets with the new starter, along with their volunteer line manager.


It's a chance for new volunteers to share their skills and interests, ask questions, and gain a clear understanding of the Scouts' values, policies, and safeguarding commitments.

Appointments to the Board

What does the Board of Trustees do?

The Board of Trustees is Crosby District Scouts' governing body. It acts collectively and in the interests of the members of Scouts locally. It is ultimately responsible for making sure that our District can sustainably deliver a fantastic programme for our young people to develop skills for life - safely, legally, and in line with our charitable purpose.

The Board do not manage the Groups or Sections – its role is to ensure the District is managed the way it wishes to be. It does this by agreeing a strategy and being accountable for its delivery and its legal and regulatory responsibilities.

The Board is comprised of 4 Ex-Officio Trustees and up to 6 Nominated Trustees but there can be more. Its members come from a variety of backgrounds, from healthcare, conservation and education to business. The Board normally meet 3-4 times a year, not including visits to the District's Groups.

How are Trustees appointed?

Our constitution requires that every year, there is opportunity for candidates to put themselves forward as a Trustee. The candidate will share a statement on their suitability to meet the needs of the District and deliver the duties of a Trustee competently. There is more information on becoming a trustee here (Scouts.org.uk).

Trustee elections are managed on behalf of the Board by the Appointments Secretary. This person will recommend to the Board which candidate(s) are best suited to fulfil the defined criteria and the needs of the Board. An invitation to express interest in trusteeship has been shared with all Crosby District volunteers, parents and guardians and to members of the public.

We've seen some promising growth in the 2025 census, with a 6.19% increase in youth membership and a 12.9% growth in adult membership. A highlight on the past year was the opening of a new Squirrel Drey at 12th Crosby.

Looking ahead, our key focus areas will be addressing the reduction in Beaver scouts' numbers. While we've seen solid overall growth in adult membership, this has been concentrated in certain groups. We will be looking at how to encourage adult volunteers in other areas and have already reached out to the Growth & Communities team for support. There are some fantastic examples of recruitment initiatives already, such as the 2nd Crosby Parent-Helper rota and recruitment push on local community social media. 4th Crosby have had great success recruiting parents to volunteer positions and onboarding existing Scout volunteers who have moved to our area.

We'd love to see each section in every group set the goal to grow their youth membership by at least one new young person this year. With everyone's continued dedication, we're confident we can continue the positive momentum and hopefully achieve this goal.
